Dear Parents/Carers,

Another busy week at Byfleet as we have been preparing for staff to start using Lateral Flow Tests from next week. Our outdoor gym and climbing wall is being finalised today (please see the photos in today's assembly video) – we will share the final photographs with you in next week's newsletter. Thank you also to parents for working so hard to juggle home learning – we appreciate how difficult this may be but have seen some excellent engagement from our children and it's great to see so much work being shared with the class teachers. Please could we remind parents of Critical Worker/vulnerable children who are being taught in school – **mixing with other households outside of your support bubble out of school hours will revoke your child's place with us at Byfleet** as we cannot risk putting our children in school and our staff's lives at risk.

### Remote Learning

- Parents/Carers of Reception, Year 1, 2 and 3 children may come to school from next week to collect phonics reading books if they wish. If your child is in upper key stage 2 and still reading these books, you are also welcome to come and collect some books for them. Miss Payne has sent out a letter outlining the information. Collection days are:

- We currently have 32% of our children with us in school, which is still a high proportion – if you are able to work from home, we urge that you please give up your space in school so that we can reduce our numbers. At present we have **every** member of our teaching staff either teaching our Critical worker/vulnerable children in school or setting work on Google Classroom and delivering remote learning. We are incredibly stretched but continue to provide the best education we are able to at present. If a member of staff were to fall ill then we will have to unfortunately ask that these children stay at home and access remote learning for the duration of the absence.
- We currently have several parents each week requesting for their children to return to school, despite not being classified as vulnerable or Critical Worker. We unfortunately are unable to offer any further spaces due to capacity however urge parents to reach out to us if we are able to support or advise with home learning or other queries about how your children are coping at home – we are here to help and will do our best!

### National Assessments



It is no surprise, given the major interruption to learning, that statutory assessments have been cancelled for Year 2 and Year 6 SATs, Year 1 Phonics Screening Check and Year 4 Multiplication Check for this academic year. We will keep parents updated once we have received further guidance from the government. As a school, despite moving to remote learning, staff are still working hard to assess children's work which is why it is important that you submit their learning. If this lockdown continues into Spring 2, we will be sending home the NLS assessment papers that we were due to use with the children in school, to gauge their current levels. Mrs Elliott, who is responsible for Assessment and Data, will be in touch later in the term to outline how we are going to run these assessments for our children at home – we may need to be creative in our approach. We want to reassure you that these tests needn't put any additional strain on children but merely an opportunity of us to broadly gauge their progress and for you as parents to see what types of questions your children are exposed to so that you can further support them at home.

### Chromebook Donations

Since the start of this lockdown, we have issued 16 devices to our families to help them access remote learning – these have been an essential resource which we are fortunate to have. This week, we have been completely overwhelmed by the kindness and generosity of others as we have received 32 new chromebooks:

- 15 from ASC (American School Cobham)
- 12 from DfE (Department of Education)
- 1 from a kind parent
- 4 from a local Byfleet Crowdfund (Byfleet Charity)



We are grateful for these kind donations and looking forward to seeing how these are going to benefit our Byfleet children.



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## Weekly Themes

The foundation subjects are being covered through 'Weekly Themes'. These are themes which will be consistent from Years 1-6. Your child's teacher will set an activity each day relating to one of the 'Foundation Subjects' linked to the week's theme. We hope that having a consistent theme will make Remote Learning easier for families who have children in different years as they can share the learning as a whole family.

Here is an overview of each theme:

Week 3 - RE week - Christianity

Week 4 - Chinese New Year (this is being taught ahead of Chinese New Year on 12th February)

Week 5 - Well-being week (in line with Children's Mental Health Week)

Week 6 - Internet Safety (in line with Safer Internet Day on 9th February)
