Dear Parents/Carers,

I can't quite believe we are halfway through the school year! I would like to express my thanks to all the parents/carers and Byfleet families for your continued support over the past 6 weeks. Needless to say, it has been a demanding half term for all of us, trying to juggle remote learning, working and not being able to go out and socialise due to this lockdown. The additional pressures placed on us this lockdown appear to be unlike any of the previous two, but I am confident that once the weather starts to warm and the days become lighter, so will our spirits lift in the coming weeks. Thank you for making things a little less onerous for us at Byfleet; whether you have been homeschooling or working as a critical worker – we appreciate everything that you have done to support Byfleet whilst we have been trying our best to provide learning for our children.





I would like to extend this gratitude to the wonderful staff at Byfleet who have worked tirelessly to give our Byfleet children and families the best deal possible. I hope you all have a well-deserved break and keep safe and well.

We have had some wonderful feedback from parents regarding the 1-1 pupil google hangout calls teachers made this week. It sounds like the children really benefited from this dedicated wellbeing time, which we thought would be a great way to end this challenging term.

Great things to celebrate at Byfleet this half term:

- The installation of a 16-piece outdoor gym, a climbing wall and climbing equipment for Key Stage 1 & 2 children
- The installation of climbing equipment and a moving bridge for Reception children
- A successful introduction of Google Classroom and G-suite which has allowed us to offer strong remote learning, daily contact between families, the class teachers and children and opportunities for video calls to take place for all our children



- An additional 32 chrome books to help increase our computing and curriculum provision for all our children
- 97% staff attendance staff wellbeing continues to be a priority for us. Without healthy, happy staff, we are unable to offer our best to the children
- 97 % pupil attendance well done. This is above the national average (96%)
- We are fortunate to have had no bubble closures or confirmed COVID cases at Byfleet
- Year 5 liaised virtually with famous author Michael Morpurgo what a memorable moment!
- All staff have had access to Google Level 1 Training as part of our dedication to professional development






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 We won a Safeguarding Award from Safeguarding Alliance – in recognition of our efforts to keep our school and community safe during COVID

Year 6s

- It was great to see our Year 6s wearing their new 'leavers' hoodies' with their names on. If you haven't already done so, please collect your Year 6 hoody from the school office. Year 6s are welcome to wear these into school each day (and online too!) to celebrate their final year with us.
- It won't be long until the Year 6s find out which secondary school they've received a place at the start of March.



• We are yet to hear from the government regarding arrangements for the Spring term. As mentioned in my Headteacher Briefing Google Hangout call with you, we often find out what is happening at the same time as parents, which poses challenges for us being able to keep you updated. I believe there will be a government briefing on Monday 15th February (during half term). As soon as I have more information, I will let you know.

From Monday 22nd February, for week 1 and 2 of Spring 2, Byfleet Primary will

- be open for the <u>current Critical Workers and Vulnerable children only, and</u>
 <u>anyone who we have contacted personally to invite their children back</u>. We
 have increased our pupil numbers to 15 in each class and any pupil rejoining us in school has been notified this week and accepted their space. All other children should continue to access remote learning via
 Google Classroom from home. Please be aware that teachers will continue to take the morning register via
 Google Hangout for the children accessing remote learning, however will then be teaching full time once
 this register call has ended so <u>may only be able to respond to your child's work/queries at the end of the school day.</u> We appreciate this may add some pressure for parents as they may need to monitor their
 child's learning more closely from Monday 22nd February as class teachers are unable to be 'on hand' as frequently thank you for your patience and understanding with this.
- From week 3 onwards (Monday 8th March), the government is proposing changes for additional children returning to school we'll keep you updated when we know more.
- Reading books continue to be available in the atrium for you to swap each week. On top of all that you do, please continue to make time to read with your child every day.
- If you require additional writing or maths books for your children to use, we have made these available in the atrium for you to help yourself. Year 1, 2, 3 and Year 5 are ready to move onto their Maths No Problem text book 2 these are also available in the atrium for collection so please pop down to collect these so your children can start their new workbook when we return in Spring 2.

School Update

Parent/Carer meetings will take place on Wednesday 3rd March and Thursday 4th March. A separate
email has been sent out for you to book your session. Please note, <u>if your child is on the SEN register,</u>
then a double slot will be made available to discuss their SEN Support Arrangement targets so please
book 2 consecutive slots.







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Test and Trace over half term

Please note that as we break for half term we are required to be involved in track and trace 2 days after the last day of teaching.

If your child gets COVID symptoms in the 2 days after Friday 12th February (either Saturday 13th February or Sunday 14th February) and they have a test that comes back positive, you should contact the school. You are able to email the school on info@byfleet.surrey.sch.uk to let us know up until Tuesday 16th February at 10am. This would be to inform us that your half term plans will be to isolate for 10 days, and we will be in the position to inform any other families whose children have been in contact with your child during the last couple of days at school.



If your child develops symptoms after Sunday 14th February, you should not contact the school. Instead you should follow the government's track and trace procedure

www.gov.uk/guidance/nhs-test-and-trace-how-it-works . The main symptoms of Coronavirus in children are:

- A high temperature
- A new continuous cough
- A loss of taste or smell

We have also been advised that in some cases children display a sore throat or upset stomach.

This week we emphasised the importance of keeping ourselves safe as part of Safer Internet Day. As most of us would have experienced the occasional inappropriate online link, advert or song pop up, these are often due to our settings not being secure enough. This can be managed by setting parental controls, which can easily be done by following this link. We urge parents to please check that the necessary controls are in place

to avoid our children being exposed to inappropriate content - thanks.
